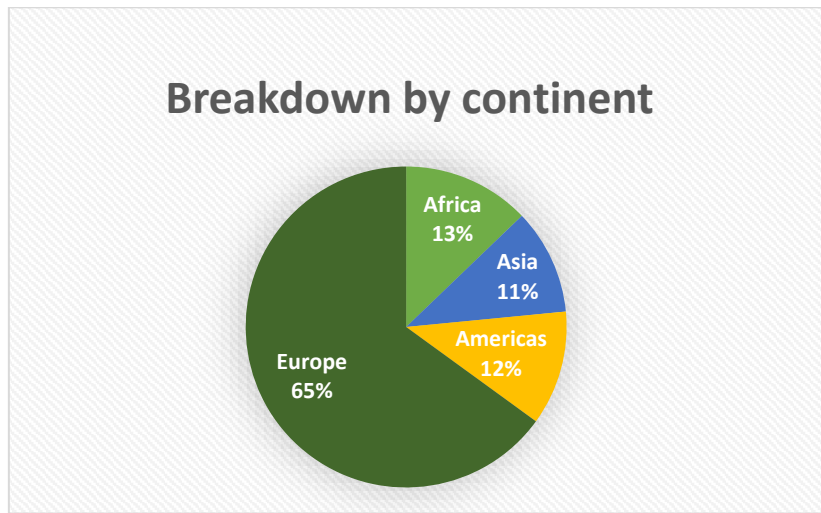


ICCP-CA statistics as of June 30, 2022

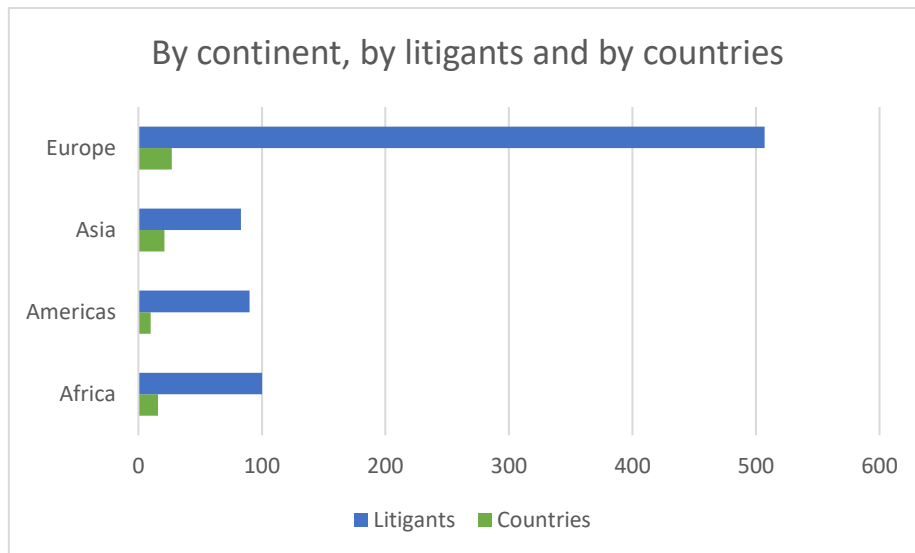
As of June 30, 2022, the ICCP-CA's case list includes 186 cases, including 81 actions brought against international arbitral awards and 19 appeals about exequatur, i.e. a total of 100 cases in the field of international arbitration, which represents 54% of the activity of the ICCP-CA.

From January 1st of 2022 to June 30th of 2022, 52 judgments have been rendered by the ICCP-CA : 28 judgments regarding actions brought against international arbitral awards (54% of the judgments), 7 judgments regarding jurisdiction (13% of the judgments), 5 judgments regarding appeals of exequatur orders (10% of the judgments) and 12 judgments for other disputes on the merits (23% of the judgments).

The duration of proceedings regarding these judgments is 22 months on average for actions brought against international arbitral awards, 6 months on average for appeals against decisions on jurisdiction, 19 months on average for appeals of exequatur orders and 15 months on average for all other disputes. The overall average duration of proceedings before the ICCP-CA in all matters is 18 months.



The total number of litigants, as of June 30, 2022, amounts to 780, coming from 74 different countries covering all continents but Oceania. 65% of the number of litigants are European and represent 27 of the 75 countries covered. The remaining 35% of litigants come from Africa for 13% (representing 16 countries), from Americas for 12% (representing 10 countries) and from Asia for 11% (representing 21 countries).



The European most represented countries are France (20.5% of total number of litigants) and Germany (10.3% of the total number of litigants). As for Americas, US nationals are the most represented (5.1% of the total number of litigants) while for Africa, Cameroon nationals are the most represented with 3.3% of the total number of litigants. The Asian countries are poorly represented, the most significant being the Philippines with 2.1% of the total number of litigants.
