

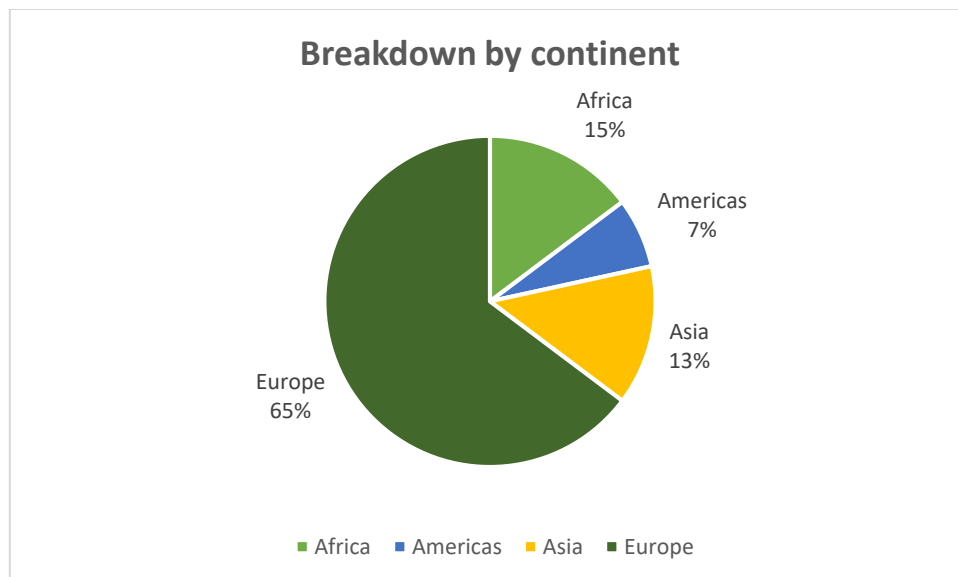
ICCP-CA statistics as of December 31, 2022

As of December 31, 2022, the ICCP-CA's case list includes 223 cases, including 91 actions brought against international arbitral awards and 22 appeals about exequatur, i.e. a total of 113 cases in the field of international arbitration, which represents 51% of the judicial activity of the ICCP-CA.

From January 1st, 2022 to December 31st, 2022, 108 judgments have been rendered by the ICCP-CA, 56 judgments regarding international arbitration (52% of total judgments rendered in 2022) and 52 judgments for other disputes on the merits (48% of total judgments rendered in 2022).

The overall average duration of proceedings before the ICCP-CA in all matters is 17 months. For actions in the field of international arbitration, the average duration is 22 months and, for all other disputes on the merits, it is 13 months.

For 2022, the litigants come from 57 different countries covering all continents but Oceania. The breakdown by continents is as follows: 65% from Europe (representing 25 countries); 15% from Africa (representing 12 countries), 13% from Asia (representing 15 countries) and 7% from Americas (representing 5 countries).



For Europe, the most represented countries in 2022 are France (27.3% of the total number of litigants), Germany (5%) and the United-Kingdom (4.7%). For Americas, US nationals are the most represented in 2022 (3.2% of the total number of litigants). For Africa, Tunisian nationals are the most represented in 2022 with 3.2% of the total number of litigants. The Asian countries are poorly represented, the most significant being the Phillipines with 2.9% of the total number of litigants.
