
STATISTICS OF THE ICCP-CA AS OF 30 JUNE 2023

As of 30 June 2023, the role of the ICCP-CA includes 222 cases, of which 109 are application for setting aside of an arbitral award and 5 are appeals in exequatur matters, making a total of 114 cases in the field of international arbitration, which represents 51% of the ICCP-CA's judicial activity.

From 1st January 2023, to 30 June 2023, the ICCP-CA has rendered 55 judgments: 30 judgments within the scope of arbitration (55% of total judgments rendered during this period), and 25 within the scope of other litigations on the merits (45% of total judgments).

The overall average duration of proceedings before the ICCP-CA, on all matters, is 13 months. For cases falling within the scope of arbitration, the average duration is 17 months, while for other litigations on the merits, it is 9 months.

The parties involved are from 45 different countries. The breakdown by continent is as follows: 55% from Europe (representing 19 countries), 22% from Asia (representing 15 countries), 18% from Africa (representing 7 countries), and 5% from the Americas (representing 4 countries).



For Europe, the breakdown outside of France is quite even, with many countries around 3-4%. In the Americas, American nationals are the most represented (3%). In Africa, three countries are above 5%: Cameroon, Ivory Coast, and Libya. In Asia, countries are generally poorly represented except for the Philippines (8%).
