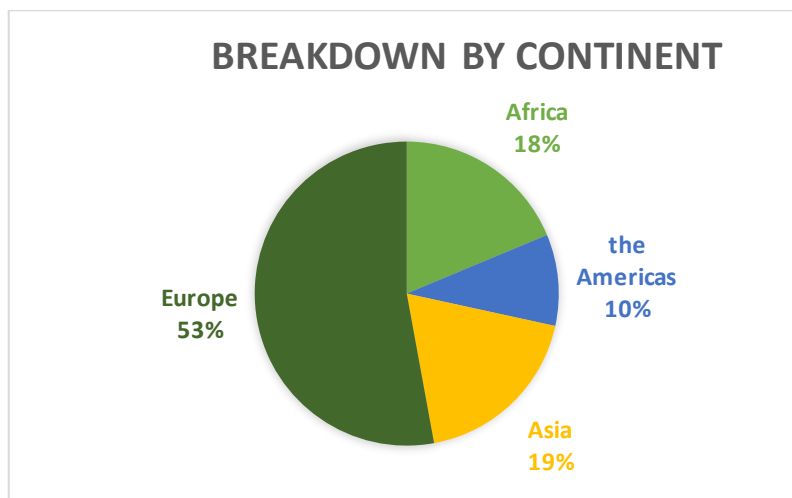


STATISTICS OF THE ICCP-CA AS OF 31 DECEMBER 2023

As of 31 December 2023, the role of the ICCP-CA includes 231 cases, of which 97 are application for setting aside of an arbitral award and 9 are appeals in exequatur matters. International commercial disputes thus account for just over half of the Chamber's litigation, international arbitration, with 106 cases, accounting for 46 % of its activity.

From 1 January 2023 to 31 December 2023, the ICCP-CA rendered 83 judgments: 48 judgments on arbitration (58 % of judgments rendered during this period) and 35 judgments in other international trade disputes on the merits (42%). The overall average duration of proceedings before the ICCP-CA, all matters included, is 16 months. For arbitration cases, the average duration is 19 months, and for other substantive disputes it is 11 months.

The parties come from 23 different countries. The breakdown by continent for all types of dispute is as follows: 53% from Europe (representing 23 countries), 19% from Asia (representing 16 countries), 18% from Africa (representing 10 countries), and 10% from the Americas (representing 6 countries).



In Europe, the breakdown outside France is fairly uniform, with many countries at around 3-5%. In America, American nationals are the most represented (6.5%). In Africa, two countries account for almost 5%: Cameroon and Libya. In Asia, countries are generally poorly represented apart from the Philippines (almost 6%).
